

International Training Week

« Role of Landscape in territories projects »

28 May - 1st June, 2018



/ Context

The International Training Week is the annual meeting of stakeholders who contribute to the Heritage protection and valorization. It brings a practical training to International stakeholders, contribute to the development of an International platform about Heritage, participate in the International outreach of participating territories and encourage the development of decentralized cooperation.

The Week is organized by Sites & Cités remarquables, in partnership with the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture, but also the City of Bordeaux and the Embassies of partner countries.

2018 will be the 4th edition. The three past editions have brought together and formed 44 stakeholders, from 20 countries.



/ 2018 Theme

The theme of the 2018 Edition will be « Role of Landscape in territories projects »

The international local authorities are faced by the issues of Heritage protection and valorization. The shared objective is to transform Heritage in a tool for the sustainable development of territories. But these projects cannot be designed as isolated parts. They need to be designed as part of a coherent whole, where the landscape plays a crucial role.

The natural landscape, the cultural landscape, the urban landscape plays indeed an important role in territories projects. This Week, through workshops and field visits, will bring a practical training to the Stakeholders about the following questions :

- What role plays the landscape in territories projects ?
- How to identify, know the landscape entities, in urban or rural areas ?
- What documentation and governance to administer landscapes ?
- What tools to improve landscapes awareness ?
- How to valorize better landscapes, towards inhabitants and tourists ?



/ Practical information

Dates : From Monday, 28th of May to Friday, 1st of June, 2018

Place : The International Training Week will take place in the City of Bordeaux. A visit out of the town is scheduled the Wednesday, 30th of May.

Budget : The participation to the formation includes the air travel from the origin country to the City of Bordeaux and the visa (if needed). These fees can be covered by the partner local authority or an external body (Embassy, **French Institute...**).

The organizer covers the fees for 5 hotel nights (from Sunday to Friday), the meals, the travel expenses in the City of Bordeaux and during the field visit.

Conditions : To attend the International Training Week, the people who want to participate need to send to Sites & Cités remarquables their CV and a letter explaining their choice to participate to the Training. A simultaneous translation French – English will be provided.

The participants must be French-speaking or English-speaking.

The training is limited to 15 participants maximum.
