
From its imposing height (10 metres) and length (25 metres), the Calais Dragon keeps watch over the town.

How about a ride on board? Climb along the dragon's tail, on to the covered viewing platform built into its back, and off you go on an unforgettable «dragon-paced» 20-minute journey.

As a Dragon of the sea, as well as of the earth, wind and fire, it spits out flames, smoke and water in various forms.

Don't be misled by its imposing size: the Dragon is capable of lying down, getting up, rearing on its hind legs, running up to 4 km/h and beating its wings!

The essence of the approach (inherited from the company La Machine in Nantes) lies in movement. 



Notre Dame church and its Tudor gardens

The church is one of the oldest monuments remaining in the town, its style greatly influenced by the presence of the English between 1347 and 1558. It bore signs for many years of the destruction inflicted upon it during World War II. Following substantial restoration work, you can now once again admire the 17th century Flemish ornamental altar screen, the impressive wrought-iron railings in the Choir, and the Virgin Mary's Chapel. It was here that the marriage of Charles de Gaulle to Yvonne Vendroux, from Calais, was celebrated in 1921. A special feature of the church is the landscaped garden surrounding it and the nearby Royal Water Tank designed by Vauban.
